Course repeat clarification: Students may only take a class or clinic once for a grade. A clinic may be taken a 2nd time by 3L or 4L students through the Clinical Education program elective if a student earns enough hours and the work is more complex. Superscript note explanations:

- 1 Adv. Legal Research is limited to 20 students with priority given to 3rd- and 4th-year students.
- 2 Civil Self Help Center clinic - option to take for 1, 2 or 3 units. Available to 3rd- and 4th-year students only
- 3 Community Property is limited to 25 students and requires completion of 2nd year classes, and Real Property preferred
- 4 Moot Court limited to 16 students, priority given to 3rd- and 4th-year students.
- 5 Disability Law Clinic is limited to 6 students. (Option to take for 1 or 2 units also.)
- 6 Family Law Clinic is limited to 2 students. (First three training class sessions meet 6:00 – 9:00 P.M.)
- 7 Advanced Legal Writing is limited to 20 students.
- 8 Elder Law is limited to 3 students.
- 9 Clinical Education is available to 3rd- and 4th-year students only.
